Subject: Disclosure and Reporting Requirements Related to Foreign Collaborations

The University of Colorado Colorado Springs is committed to fostering international research and educational collaborations; we are focused on creating global impact by cultivating and supporting collaboration on campus and across the globe while also promoting full transparency surrounding all interactions with external sponsors, industry and foreign entities.

As many of you may be aware, there have been recent statements and activities from governmental agencies related to national security with higher education and research organizations. We are reaching out to help ensure you are aware of these matters as you cultivate international collaborations.

The Director of the National Institutes of Health (NIH), Francis Collins, issued a "Foreign Influence Letter to Grantees" and testified to the Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions Committee regarding concerns about systematic programs of foreign influence in U.S. research. Dr. Collins reminded the research community to "disclose all forms of other support and financial interests, including support coming from foreign governments or other foreign entities...in accordance with the NIH Grants Policy Statement, [on] all applications and progress reports" and indicated that NIH's Office of Extramural Research (OER) will be providing additional information in the future.

Please note these concerns are not limited to NIH. The Department of Defense, the National Science Foundation and Department of Energy have also expressed similar concerns.

While international collaboration is encouraged and supported, we ask faculty and staff to help ensure compliance and transparency. If you are engaging in research or educational activities that involve international collaboration you are expected to:

- Disclose activities, including those with foreign entities in proposals, progress reports, and final technical reports as required by the sponsoring agency. Check specific agency guidance or contact the Office of Sponsored Programs and Research Integrity osp@uccs.edu.
- Key personnel should ensure they disclose all applicable other support and collaborators
  as required by the sponsoring agency. Check specific agency guidance or contact the
  Office of Sponsored Programs and Research Integrity <a href="mailto:osp@uccs.edu">osp@uccs.edu</a>. Key personnel
  may want to review all pending proposals and active awards to ensure that all foreign

components have been disclosed. If an omission or error is identified, contact the Office of Sponsored Programs and Research Integrity <a href="mailto:osp@uccs.edu">osp@uccs.edu</a> to have the error corrected.

- Install relevant IT security updates and report any suspected compromises to the Information Technology Security Office. <a href="https://www.uccs.edu/oit/security">https://www.uccs.edu/oit/security</a>

- Comply with U.S. export control regulations, as applicable, when campus approves
  publication restrictions; traveling internationally and attending conferences; participating
  in international collaborations; using proprietary information; working with international
  staff and students; hosting international visitors; shipping materials internationally; or
